FOR FURTHER THOUGHT:

1.	Read John 6:15-21. Describe the passage in your own words. What do you think it would have felt like to be out in the storm? What do you think might have been going through the minds of the disciples?
2.	Why were the disciples frightened by the sight of Jesus coming near?
3.	What words does Jesus' use to comfort his disciples in John 6:20? What does it tell us that Jesus identified himself first and then encouraged them not to be afraid? Why does that order matter so much? When might the presence of Jesus frighten you?
4.	When do you feel closest to God? When do you feel farthest away? Read Psalm 139:7-10. How do the words of the psalmist impact your answer? How does a right or wrong understanding of the gospel influence your response?
5.	How do you think the events of that night impacted the disciples? What evidence do you find in Peter's confession in John 6:66-69?
6.	Has there been a time in your own life where God strengthened your faith by bringing you through a difficult storm? How did it impact how you saw God? How did it affect your worship?
