- 5. Do you feel like you are stagnant in your growth? What can/should you do about it?
- 6. Take time as a group to pray for your growth in the coming year, as a group and as individuals. Be specific about what you would like to see God doing for each of you, whether it's repenting a specific sin, growing in a fruit of the Spirit that you lack, or providing what is needed to be involved in the things that lead to spiritual growth.
