- 5. Why does Paul order public rebuke for church leaders who persist in sin (v20)? What happens when this is not done?
- 6. Among the qualifications to become an elder here, one must have been a member for at least a year and a small group leader for at least 3 months. What would you say to someone, based on vss 21-25, who suggests that those requirements are too restrictive?
